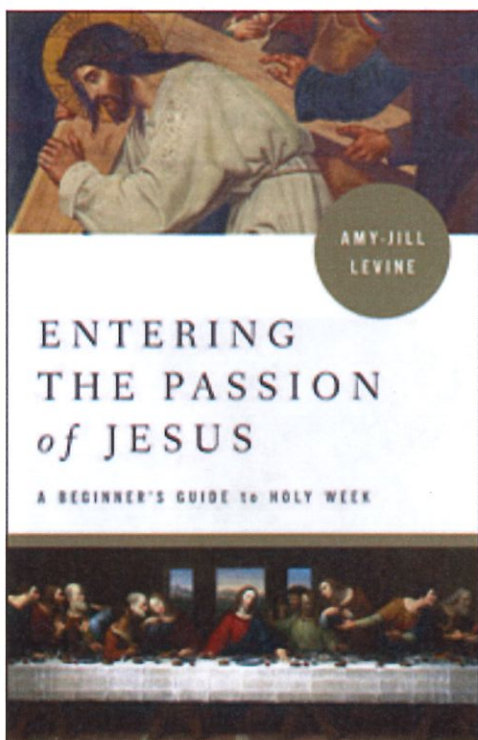

## Lenten Study to begin on February 26



The Lenten Study for 2020 will be *Entering the Passion of Jesus*, by Amy-Jo Levine. This six-week study begins on Ash Wednesday, February 26. There will be a 10 a.m. and 4:15 class available.

The study will look at the history and literature surrounding the last days of Jesus' life. Amy-Jo Levine is the professor of New Testament and Jewish Studies at Vanderbilt Divinity School in Nashville. Her Jewish perspective and teaching gifts allows the reader to learn more about the culture and history in which Jesus was born, lived, and died. Her studies help us to see our Christian scriptures with new eyes as we see and understand the Jewish influences in our scriptures.

Sign-up sheets are available on the round table outside the sanctuary. The cost of the study is \$12. I purchased all large print books because they were \$3 less!! You may pay for the book by putting your check in the offering plate or in an envelope and marking it BIBLE STUDY.
