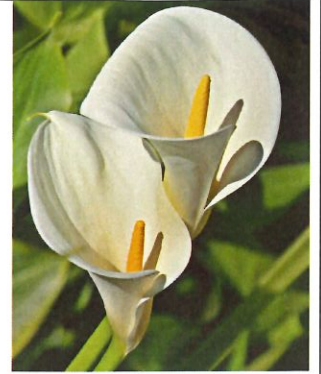


Kenwood Park United Methodist Church
